#### What has been adjusted:


Face-to-face visits and events truly make a difference! We are all recognizing the value of connection. Many of these have been moved to a digital format.





#### A note from Michelle: When it's not all roses...



I am often asked where I get such energy, especially when I am speaking. When asked if I move around when I teach, I laugh and politely request a cordless mike.

When my niece moves her entire body to make arepas (a Venezuelan food), and I ask my sister if I really taught her to move so dramatically. My sister gently replies, "Have you met yourself?"

No matter what the context of my exuberance, I have recently decided to answer, "Joy is my middle name. I'm just trying to live that out and share some."

However, the joy in my voice, the bounce in my step, and the spark in my eyes has been a little lacking over the past few weeks.

Personally, I have had a resurgence of some chronic health issues and the triggering of a few new ones. The phrase, "The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak," comes to mind. If I am not careful, my frustrations with these challenges can steal my joy.

We are all in a period of adjustment. With plans changed, even cancelled, layers of uncertainty can cloud our thinking and frustrate our efforts to move forward and to navigate a "new normal."

Extroverts feel isolated. Planners wish they had written everything in pencil and now start every sentence with "Lord willing..." Grief is a part of everyone's current reality and we all manage it differently.

In the thorns and storms of life, may we "Be still and know that [He] is God" (Ps. 46:10). May we remember that "The joy of the Lord is our strength" (Neh. 8:10) not our own joy or our own strength.

Fear is rampant, but Truth is greater.

God promises to turn our mourning into dancing and our sorrow into joy (Jer. 31:13). When life is not all roses, the Divine Gardener is still in control.
